



CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

We are busy gearing up for one of our biggest weeks of the summer - Vacation Bible School! VBS 2015 will have a Heroes of the Bible theme, and it will run August 3-7 from 9AM-noon. We will be taking a look at David, Ester, Daniel, Joseph, and our number one superhero, Jesus. If you've never been involved with a VBS before, you may be curious as to how it is run day-to-day. Each morning, the kids gather in the sanctuary in their age groups (pK-K, 1-2 grade, 3-4 grade, 5-6 grade). We begin by introducing what the topic will be, and the kids learn their memory verse of the day. Then, the different age groups begin a rotation, learning about each hero through a story, music, crafts, games, and a snack. The 5-6 group is the exception. These older kids begin in the sanctuary and then head out into Linden to do a community service project, and they return for the story and snack. Finally, all of the kids regroup in the sanctuary to review the verse and sing a song. Whew, it's a busy week!

This year will be extra special because the curriculum is all being planned by our members. Kristen Garmyn, Fred Lewis, Gemma Amendola, Kim Neuville, Donna Ingamells, and Gretchen Sutto have been meeting since last November to begin planning for this year's VBS. We have decided upon the characters, the verses, and have matched the games, crafts, and snacks to complement the theme. While all the other churches will be rotating through the same three VBS curriculums that are available this year, ours will be new and fresh, which is really exciting!

As you may have been able to tell, it takes A LOT of people to make VBS happen. We need volunteers to help register kids as they arrive. Nine leaders are needed to help guide the different age groups around. At least two volunteers each are needed to lead crafts, story, games, and snack time. Extra runners are always useful to hang out with the younger two groups. On top of that, we need volunteers to help us decorate and clean-up at the end. To make a long story short (too late), we need YOU!

I don't like to just think about our youngest disciples as the future of the church; they are our present. Proverbs 22:6 reminds us to "train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." We need to be training up our kids now in the present so they will be well equipped to lead us into the future. Music Ministry Kimball Pipe Organ.

Coming to the Sanctuary of Linden Church is The Kimball Pipe Organ Op. 7027 built between 1927- 28. This small instrument is donated by Wendy Mueller and Family. It was acquired from Christ Enrichment Center, formally, Christ Episcopal Church, where it was played until 1988. Before its move, the console, windchests, bellows, swell shades and pipes were located in the balcony and the blower in the basement of the building. There are nine ranks of pipes totaling close to 520 pipes. A rank is 61 for the keyboards and 32 for the pedals. The Kimball console (keyboards and pedal) will be placed where the Allen is located. All pipe work will sound from behind the Chancel wall like the Allen, the difference is you will be able to feel the Kimball because it moves the air surrounding it. Before the first note is heard, the organ will be refurbished and reconfigured to fit the new space. Also it will be rewired to comply with new wire codes and when in place, all pipes will be voiced for Linden's Sanctuary. If you want to help with refurbishing, which entails releathering, sanding and shellacking windchest, wiring relays and switches for the instrument, contact or see Ed Arter. For this project, many hands will see it refurbished in short order. Thank you again to Wendy Mueller and Family for beautiful gift. *Soli Deo*
