#### RAMBLINGS FROM THE REVEREND

THIS MONTH: READING THE BIBLE IN A YEAR

This year a group of us, spearheaded by Kim Herbert, are reading the Bible in a year. Please see p. 8 of this newsletter for the schedule, a way to get involved, and some great reasons that you should join us in this endeavor.

I am pleased to be doing this and excited that Kim has felt called to help us get closer to God's Word. As we start this adventure together, I would like to use some of this space to share a few tips that I think will be handy as we move along.

- 1. Find a buddy It can be difficult to do something new by yourself. A buddy can help commiserate with you when you fall behind and encourage you to catch back up. And vice versa. You will inspire each other (check out Proverbs 27:17).
- 2. Find a Bible Take a quick look at the Bible that you have (if you have one). Is it a Bible you enjoy reading? Is the language understandable? Is the font big enough? If you are on the market for a Bible, I recommend the English Standard Version (ESV) or the New International Version (NIV). We use the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) in worship and the Bibles in the pews are Today's English Version (from 40 years ago). If you don't have a Bible,

we have plenty in the library, please stop by and grab one.

- 3. Read it like a book This might seem to be goofy advice, but if you have tried reading the Bible before, you have probably found yourself reading much more slowly to try to perfectly and completely understand each and every word and then dwell upon each verse for awhile. This is a wonderful way to read scripture and I highly encourage it, but it won't get you through this particular adventure unless you have a couple of hours a day. Instead, try reading at the pace you typically read at. Ignore the chapter and verse markers (the chapters in the Bible are way shorter than in most books but we tend to see reading three chapters as reading a ton). If you are perplexed by something, make a quick mark by it and move on it might make sense in the context of the whole narrative. You can always ask me if you are confused about something and I will help guide you through it.
- **4. Do you need a schedule?** Some people thrive on keeping a strict routine. Others find routines confining. Decide what works best for you ad then be flexible with that.

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In other news, there is plenty of information in this newsletter about all the wonderful ministry going on here - I encourage you to read it all! I would like to highlight that we will have one worship gathering on January 25 at 10:00 followed by our annual meeting and luncheon - please join us, it is a wonderful time of fellowship and learning about the ministries of the church. We will also ordain/install elders and deacons at both services on January 4 and the officer retreat is January 16 & 17. Please pray for our elders and deacons as they begin a new chapter in the spiritual nurture and leadership of the church. I also encourage you to pray about how God is calling you into Kingdom living in 2015.

In the event you have a pastoral care emergency after office hours, the Deacon on Duty is available to take your call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. They will be able to notify the proper people and provide you the care you need.

## PER CAPITA

As the New Year begins we would like to remind you about the annual Per Capita Dues. Per capita is an amount of money, this year \$25.00 per member, which our congregation pays to our denomination, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This money is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. It is the money that enables us to work with other Presbyterian churches in our presbytery and across the country. It is also money that allows us to work with other churches to further the mission of Jesus Christ around the world.

Linden Presbyterian Church will pay \$8,500.00 in Per Capita Dues this year. We will have to pay this whether you contribute your per capita or not. How can you help? By contributing your portion of per capita, you can free up dollars in our regular budget for the work of our congregation in the church and community. If you haven't yet contributed, we hope you will consider doing so. Each year, \$3,000-\$4,000 comes out of our budget to pay for members who do not pay their per capita. Please help us and do your part. This isn't the most glamorous piece of giving, but it does facilitate the workings of our congregation and spread the Word of Christ throughout the world.

How important is per capita? Here are some examples:

- Does our congregation want to benefit from relationships and cooperation with other Presbyterian churches across the country? When we look for pastors, it is the presbytery that provides resources for us. If we have a legal problem, the presbytery helps us. If we had a crisis in the congregation, it is the presbytery that would help us. Your per capita pays for the General Assembly meeting every two years where Presbyterians gather together to worship and discern the mind of Christ for the church.
- Does our congregation want to be involved in mission work throughout the world, sharing the gospel in all parts of the earth? In many places in our world, it is difficult to "do mission" except by working ecumenically with other churches. Your per capita helps to pay for meetings of Presbyterians with people of other Christian churches, allowing us to maintain those ties for mission.
- Do we want to benefit from helpful Presbyterian resources such as the Book of Order and The Book of Confessions? Your per capita pays for producing these basic resources, including in Spanish, Korean, and Braille.
- Do we want future generations to learn about our congregation's present work (e.g., anniversary celebrations, membership rolls, session actions)? Your per capita helps to fund the Presbyterian Historical Society preserving and sharing the Presbyterian experience.
- Do we want pastors who are well prepared to lead our congregation? Your per capita funds the preparation, administration, and grading of standard ordination examinations for seminary students.
- Do we want well-trained leaders for our presbyteries and more? Your per capita pays for annual training events for presbytery executives, stated clerks, and others who help lead our work and mission.

We do not believe in being lone rangers in the PC(USA). We need each other as we work together to share the good news of Jesus Christ. As we benefit from the gifts, skills, vision, and ministry of each other in this place, so, too, do we benefit from an even wider array of gifts and ministry of our Presbyterian brothers and sisters across the church. Your per capita pays for the programs, training, and resources that help us work together and discern the mind of Christ for the PC(USA).
