RAMBLINGS FROM THE REVEREND

THIS MONTH: CELEBRATING THANKSGIVING IN FAITH

This Thanksgiving season, let's connect to the concept of thanksgiving that we see exemplified in the scriptures and in the Christian tradition. Here are six ways to celebrate Thanksgiving from a biblical perspective:

- 1. Give yourself time to explore Thanksgiving in Scripture. First Thessalonians 5:18 reminds to give thanks in ALL circumstances! All circumstances. That can be difficult but you will see your life change when you approach every situation with God-inspired thankfulness. Here are some other verses/passages to explore concerning thanksgiving: Philippians 4:6, Psalm 7:17, Psalm 100:1-5, Psalm 107:1, Ephesians 5:20, James 1:17, Matthew 6:25-34, and Isaiah 12:1-6. There are many more, too!
- 2. Prayers of Thanksgiving. Each day set aside time in prayer to focus on one thing in the life of Jesus and His Church that you are thankful for this month. You will be amazed at how this focuses your heart and day on the glory of Jesus.
- **3. Live and serve from abundance.** Second Corinthians 9:6-15 tells us to live generously out of the many blessings we have received and is a reminder that we will continue to be blessed into the future blessing from

God is not in limited supply! God wants to bless us. So let's live out of the abundance of the blessing we have been given and will be given. Look for ways to live abundantly. This newsletter is chalk full of ways to serve!

- **4. Be a part of our community Thanksgiving worship.** We will gather together as the faithful people of Linden to worship God with other area churches on Sunday, November 22 at 7:00pm at the Free Methodist Church. Let's demonstrate that we are thankful for our brothers and sisters! This is also where we take up a key offering for the Linden Ministerial Association Emergency Fund.
- **5. Fridge of Thanksgiving.** Throughout the month of November, I encourage you to fill the front of your refrigerator with notes and photographs of blessings that you are thankful for so that you can be reminded of God's blessings.
- **6. Give people your thanks.** If you do number four, you may see people on there that you need to reach out to and personally thank. It could be a phone call or a note or a conversation but take the risk to let those people know you are thankful for them.

Six Questions to Ask Yourself

1. Will I give based on reason or by revelation?

Is my gift just what I think I can afford or is it what God wants to give through me?"No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money." Matthew 6:24 (NIV)

2. Does this amount really stretch my faith?

Do I truly believe God will provide for my needs? "God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." 2 Corinthians 9:8 (NIV)

3. Does it show I value my hope of eternal reward more than material things on earth?

Do I live only for today, without regard to my eternal future? "Put your hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Do good, be rich in good deeds, and be generous and willing to share. In this way you will lay up treasure for yourselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that you may take hold of the life that is truly life." 1Timothy 6: 17-19 (NIV)

4. Will this amount demonstrate how much I love Christ and his church family?

Do I live my life for Christ's glory and thereby contribute help to those in need? "All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need." Acts 2:44-45 (NIV)

5. Does this amount represent a genuine sacrifice?

Am I willing to offer myself as a living sacrifice for all Christ has sacrificed for me? "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" John 3:16 (NIV)

6. Does this amount express the level of thanksgiving I have for how Christ has blessed my life and family?

Do my gifts truly express how grateful I am for all I have been given? "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights." James 1:17 (NIV)

Prayerfully meditate on these questions and ask God to lead you as you and your family make your stewardship decision.

A MINUTE ON FAITH

Faith is about taking the first step.

What should you do when you know something is God's will but you're scared to death to do it? Do it anyway. Faith is about taking the first step.

You may be thinking, "But I'm waiting for God to do something?" Has it ever occurred to you that God may be waiting on you?

Throughout the Bible we see this important truth: The Holy Spirit releases his power the moment you take a step of faith. When God told Joshua to cross the Jordan River, it was at a flood stage. It was only after Joshua stepped into the river, that the waters stopped flowing and the whole nation of Israel crossed on dry ground.

God waits for you to act first. Move ahead, and do what God tells you to do regardless of your fears and feelings. In 2 Corinthians 5, the Bible says, "For our life is a matter of faith, not of sight". This is how you cooperate with the Holy Spirit.

What is God asking you to do that you haven't done yet? Take that step of Daring Faith today.

How do you get God's dream for your life? You do three things:

First, dare to ask God for it. The Bible says, "Now glory be to God, who by his mighty power at work within us is able to do far more than we would ever dare to ask or even dream of..." Ephesians 3:20 (TLB). If you want God's dream for your life, you must dare to ask him what he wants you to do. Then ask yourself, "What would I attempt for God if I knew I couldn't fail?" Let that expand your vision.

Second, believe God's promises. Never let an impossible situation intimidate you. Let it motivate you to pray more, believe more, trust more, experience more, learn more, and grow more. Faith always works in the realm of the impossible.

Third, dream big. Let the size of your God determine the size of your goal. You haven't really believed God until you've attempted something that cannot be done in the power of the flesh. God's dream for your life can only be accomplished, as Ephesians 3:20 says, "By his mighty power at work within you." If you can do it in your own strength, then it's not a God-sized dream. But the Bible says in 1 Thessalonians 5:24, "the one who calls you is faithful and he will do it!"
