RAMBLINGS FROM THE REVEREND

THIS MONTH: 4 SIGNS YOU ARE GOING DEEPER

As I surf around the too many news websites I check out every day, I've noticed something about myself that might be true for you, as well. If the title of the article has a number in it, I am more likely to click on it. For instance, "7 Ways to Lose 20lbs Next Week Without Getting Out of Your Recliner," and "3 Ways You Become a Genius By Taking Longer Showers," would definitely be popular reads, I think.

So in keeping in this spirit, I give you 4 ways to go deeper with Jesus.

- 1. **Surrender Your Life to Jesus**. Americans don't like the word surrender. If you surrender, it implies that you've been defeated and you are no longer in control. I'm going to wager that if you take a serious look at your life that you will find instances, and if you are really honest, a whole life, that has been defeated by sin (Romans 6:15-23). To put it in stark terms, you are either serving sin or you are serving God (Matthew 6:24). We are called to surrender our whole life to Christ keep nothing from him (James 4:7-10)!
- 2. **Worship in Community**. Nowhere in the Bible does it say that you should only worship if you are "getting something out of it." That's not worship, that's consumerism. If you don't get anything (enjoyment, relaxation, etc.) out of golfing, then don't golf. But this isn't how we are called to relate to the Triune God. If we are coming to worship we are coming to glorify God's name, surrender to Him, and be formed by Him and His Word in community

(John 4:23-24). If God asked you why you weren't committed to worshiping Him, do you think, "I don't like the preaching," or, "I don't like the music," will really pass muster? God wants to renew you in community with Him. Come and be renewed!

- 3. **Study the Word**. Just like being in worship, studying scripture is a habit that needs to be cultivated. It will take your commitment and will take time out of your day. If you want to grow go deeper with Jesus, you'll need to be in His word. But you know what? You can't do it alone. You need Jesus. You need Jesus to inspire you, help you endure, help you understand. There will always be someone who knows more about something than you, but don't let that prevent you from taking the first step. Crack open the Word and open yourself to God's leading.
- 4. **Turn It Over in Prayer**. Your first prayer can involve what we just talked about in number three. Let yourself grow into patterns where you are listening for God's voice. Turn your mind, heart, and spirit over to God and listen. Then when you see or hear something in your day, it will become more natural to give it to God in prayer.

Jesus has given you salvation from death and given you new life in him, but he won't force you to change your ways. He does invite you into transformation and promises to be by your side along the way. Join Jesus!


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP Raising Cheerful Givers

Part 2 - The Value of Work

This is the second in a series of articles on "Raising Cheerful Givers". Helping our children understand financial principles will not only help them manage their money, but also become joyful stewards.

According to a 2003 study, students who worked in high school are much more likely to achieve their financial goals and be knowledgeable about money than those who did not. Working in high school and college, to the extent that is doesn't interfere with schoolwork, seems to pay off later in life. Children can begin to understand the value of reward for work at a young age. The fact of the matter is that the value of work is much more than just monetary.

Teaching your child the value of work builds character. Children will grow up with more respect for the value of money and what is required to earn it. It also teaches diligence. Diligence is a work ethic that means you do the task set before you to the best of your ability in a timely fashion. Diligence encompasses honesty, purpose, energy, excellence and working heartily. "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men." (Col. 3:23) NIV

When they are too young to "work", children need a source of money that enables them to learn how to save, spend and share. One such source is an allowance. Sometimes there is debate among parents of whether an allowance is good. Some may feel that children need to understand that as part of a family, they do chores simply for the benefit of the family community. While contributing help to the family unit is very important and right, parents may miss the opportunity of a valuable teaching tool if there is no allowance.

Have you ever been in the store when your child eyes the toy that represents the latest hot "toy craze" or technological gadget that he really needs and he needs it <u>now</u>? Do you hold your ground and simply respond, "No" as you prepare to once again do battle with the crankiness that follows? Or, do smile and ask your child, "How soon will you have enough money to buy it?"

Whether the money is given or earned, the money is theirs. If they choose to blow the money on the ugliest (in your eyes) and most expensive shoes in the store, let them do it. When they are short on cash, they will realize the benefit of a wiser decision. Keep telling yourself that the reason your children are receiving money is because you want them to learn to manage it.
